Executive Summary

Assessment Context: This assessment evaluates Acme Financial Services Ltd — a mid-sized Financial Services organisation operating primarily in the UK, with additional operations in EU, operating within a regulated sector. Analysis prioritises UK DSIT and ICO frameworks as primary regulatory benchmarks, with EU AI Act conformity obligations, with FCA/PRA model risk guidance.

Acme Financial Services demonstrates an emerging commitment to AI governance but significant gaps remain across regulatory alignment, risk management, and accountability structures. Foundational policies exist but lack operational maturity for consistent, auditable governance across business units. Immediate action on regulatory compliance is required ahead of the EU AI Act August 2026 deadline.

Maturity Assessment:

At a **Developing** maturity level (52/100), Acme Financial Services has progressed beyond initial awareness but has not yet embedded governance into operational practice. Key frameworks exist on paper but are inconsistently applied across teams deploying AI.

Regulatory Readiness:

Regulatory readiness is **partially aligned** with UK DSIT principles and ISO 42001, but EU AI Act conformity assessment gaps present material risk given the August 2026 deadline.

Key Findings

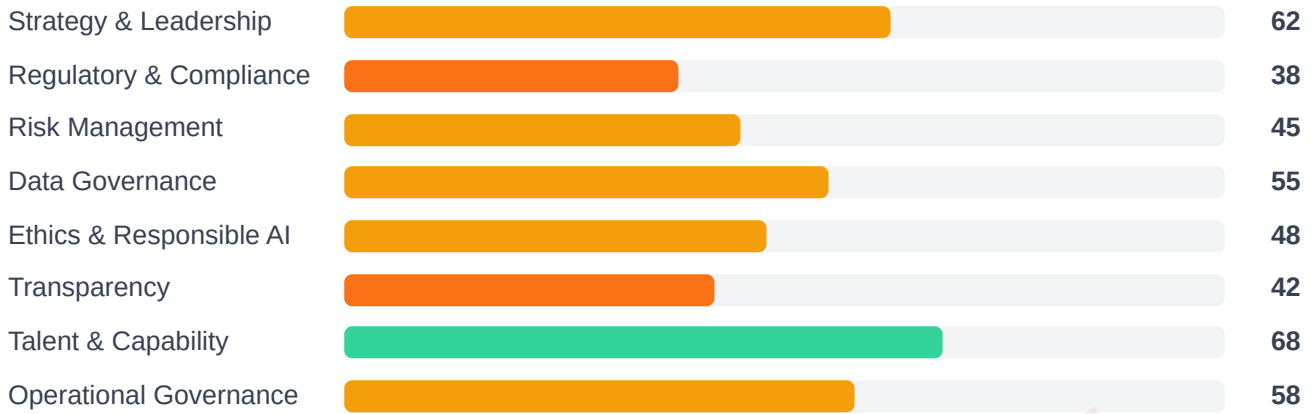
- AI register is incomplete — only 40% of AI systems across the organisation are documented, creating significant shadow AI exposure.
- No formal AI impact assessment process exists for high-risk deployments, leaving regulatory compliance gaps.
- Data governance for AI training data lacks structured lineage tracking, creating audit trail weaknesses.

Top Recommendations

- Establish a comprehensive AI register covering all AI systems, including third-party embedded AI, within 90 days.
- Implement a formal AI impact assessment framework aligned with EU AI Act risk classification before Q3 2026.
- Appoint a senior AI governance lead with cross-functional authority and direct board reporting line.

Alignment with regulatory frameworks including EU AI Act, UK DSIT, and ISO 42001.

The organisation has awareness of major regulatory frameworks but lacks operational compliance mechanisms. EU AI Act high-risk system classification has not been completed, and there is no structured conformity assessment process. UK DSIT principles are referenced in policy documents but not embedded in deployment workflows. ISO 42001 certification has not been pursued.

Key Findings

- No AI risk classification system aligned with EU AI Act categories.
- UK DSIT five principles referenced in policy but not operationalised.
- No conformity assessment process for high-risk AI systems.
- Regulatory horizon scanning is informal and ad hoc.
